What is the Cleaning Operations Part Qualification program?

The Management Edge (TME), a nationally accredited Registered Training Organisation has developed a 6-unit training program that is aligned to the national training package Certificate III in Cleaning Operations. Successful completion of the program will earn participants a nationally recognised Statement of Attainment that employers can rely on as evidence of current competence and provide credit towards completion of a full qualification. Employers are seeking people who have a formal Certificate II/III Cleaning Operations qualification. Attending this training will create more employment opportunities.

The current environment has created a large demand for qualified cleaning professionals who understand the requirements and techniques to clean work and public areas in a safe and thorough manner.

All workplaces and public spaces now have a much higher duty of care to their staff and members of the public. And it is not just a matter of appearing to do the right thing – the consequences of failure to properly fulfill workplace health and safety obligations are significant.
